**I. Called to Order at 3:04pm**

**II. Approval of Minutes** - Kevin Sanders moved to approve the minutes, and Cheryl Benningfield seconded. Approved by Senate.

**III. Speakers/Presentations**

a. Roy Nance – Printing and Distribution Services

- i. They do a lot of promotional items like pens, pencils, shirts, awards, swag in general.
- ii. He came to discuss the printing business. They do digital and offset printing.
  1. Have new Indigo 10,000 digital press. We are the only university in the world who has one. State-of-the-art digital printing machine. Weighs 26,000 pounds. Prints complete variable data to print specialized, personalized documents.
  2. Offset printing uses a big printing press with plates and ink. Used for long run jobs.
  3. Eagle Images does large-format printing for banners, pop-up banners, and other large items.
  4. Latex ink printing option allows printing on vinyl, paper, and cloth.
  5. They do binding for manuals and documents in full-service binding operation.
  6. Color printer allows for 110 color copies per minute.
  7. Can print directly onto mugs, plates, shirts, and others.
- iii. They try to keep their prices below everyone else. They deal straight with the manufacturers and allow for less cost for reducing the middleman. They are able to get the very lowest pricing no matter how many you order.
- iv. They are self-supported and are required to make their own money.
- v. They can help you produce medallions and many other promo items.
- vi. They print for non-profits as well as UNT.
- vii. Mail services is also a part of PDS. They do not handle student mail, but they do handle all intercampus mail, bulk mail, and first-class mail. They can help to design mail pieces that satisfy the requirements of USPS as well. We are biggest postal customer in the area.
- viii. They have many shirts on-hand in their sample room.

**IV. Constituency Concerns**

- a. A couple of areas at DP are having trouble with mail services. What is the issue with it?
  - i. DP is considered a rural route and does not have a mail person, so they rely on mail services.
  - ii. There are some issues with UPS and FedEx as well.
  - iii. Kristi recommends Lance Brooks and Cindy Ferrell as contacts to resolve the issue.
- b. The change in insurance – going back to BCBS – is a concern for many.
  - i. The change happens 9/1.
  - ii. They do not have a provider list for BCBS yet, but UNT has done this shift before.
  - iii. BCBS has opted into HealthSelect.
  - iv. Rachel brought up a concern regarding CVS not taking the prescription plan. Shaureece said our pharmacy plan is not changing.

- v. When employers buy insurance, it is a la carte. The package is not prepackaged like auto insurance, so different coverages exist across the spectrum.
